At only 21 years old, Nayak showcases great potential as a rim-rolling big man with the ability to finish above the rim. He had an impressive physical performance rating of 72.5 on the day. He displayed his versatility, recording eighth in the Maximum Jump test, whilst simultaneously recording sixth in the 3/4 Court Sprint. This mix of vertical explosiveness combined with physical speed makes Nayak a very interesting prospect. He has the potential to be a

high-quality two-way player, impacting the game on both ends of the court. Nayak demonstrates defensive IQ, bringing energy to his team by picking up players full court after a made basket for easy transition points. Nayak can however, work on refining his shooting form. Currently, he dips the ball quite low with a set point above his head. While this release makes his shot harder to block, it can also lead to inconsistency and reduced accuracy.

Kushal was a standout prospect at the combine, recording the second-best physical performance rating with an impressive score of 82.5. He ranked first in the Standing and Maximum Vertical Jumps, exhibiting explosive jumping ability. With an impressive 210.5cm wingspan, Kushal has all the attributes to defend at an elite level. Offensively, Kushal is a tall wing who possesses a natural shooting stroke, capable of hitting shots

from deep even with defenders in his face. Once in his shooting rhythm, he becomes nearly unstoppable for defenders. Standing at 195cm tall, Kushal has a tight handle and uses it to create open spaces for shooting. When defenders close out, his height and athleticism allow him to shoot over them. 







